

The Higher Committee of Human Fraternity—a global group of religious leaders representing Islam, Christianity and Judaism—recently announced the plans for a first-of-its-kind Abrahamic Family House to be built in Abu Dhabi.

Housing a church, mosque and synagogue, the Abrahamic Family House will be a catalyst for inter-religious dialogue and exchange, and will nurture the values of peaceful co-existence and acceptance among different beliefs, nationalities and cultures.

The project is guided by the Document on Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together, which His Holiness Pope Francis of the Catholic Church and the Grand Imam of al-Azhar, His Eminence Sheikh Ahmed el-Tayeb, signed in Abu Dhabi earlier this year.

Reflecting on the values embodied in the Abrahamic Family House, Rabbi M. Bruce Lustig, Senior Rabbi at Washington Hebrew Congregation and a member of the Higher Committee of Human Fraternity said, "This is an important opportunity for all who believe in the power of faith and humanity. It will help build bridges between religious leaders and communities as well as foster peace and harmony in an era that is too often defined by difference."
