Representatives from the governments of the United States and the United Arab Emirates explored how trade and investment across diverse industries – from artificial intelligence to medicine and logistics – will help both countries not only address the challenge of the moment, but also create a more prosperous future.

The US-UAE Economic Policy Dialogue was established in 2010 as a platform to strengthen the broad and expanding economic relationship between the two countries. For eleven years, the UAE has been the top US export destination in the Middle East. In 2019, the US enjoyed a \$15.7 billion trade surplus with the UAE – the US' third largest trade surplus globally.











This Month In History

In June 2018, the UAE Embassy in Washington, DC hosted an iftar for athletes who would go on to participate in the 2019 Special Olympics World Games in Abu Dhabi. The attendees participated in the traditional breaking of the fast and learned more about the values of Ramadan.

The <u>2019 World Games in Abu Dhabi</u> was the largest humanitarian and sporting event of the year and the first Special Olympics World Games ever held in the Middle East and North Africa. 7,500 athletes from more than 190 countries competed across 24 Olympic-style

sports at the event, which attracted more than 20,000 volunteers and an estimated half a million spectators.
