UAE Global Impact: COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution

The UAE is playing a critical role to facilitate and accelerate the distribution of COVID-19 vaccines to developing countries, and help combat the coronavirus pandemic. With its logistics networks, storage capacity and central geographic location, the UAE is helping ensure countries around the world have equitable access to vaccines against COVID-19. The UAE has provided more than 2,250 tons of medical supplies to over 136 countries worldwide.



One of the first shipments of COVID-19 vaccines distributed by COVAX arrived in Ivory Coast on February 26, 2021.

UAE Support for COVAX Initiative and Global Partners



- Emirates SkyCargo, Etihad Cargo, and DP World are working with the United Nations Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF) to support its Humanitarian Airfreight Initiative and accelerate the distribution of COVID-19 vaccines in low and lower-middle-income countries.
- The initiative brings together UAE and other global carriers that cover routes to more than 100 countries in support of the WHO's COVAX Facility a global effort aimed at equitable access to COVID-19 vaccines.
- As the supply chain crisis increases pressure on shipping and transport industries, the Abu Dhabi-based HOPE Consortium is <u>providing</u> UNICEF with additional logistics capacity to transport life-saving vaccines and supplies to countries battling COVID-19.

Dubai Vaccines Logistics Alliance

- The Dubai Vaccines Logistics Alliance combines the expertise and global reach of Emirates Airline with DP World's worldwide network of ports and logistics operations, along with the infrastructure of Dubai Airports and International Humanitarian City (IHC) to distribute vaccines worldwide.
- The alliance focuses in particular on emerging markets, where populations have been hard hit by the pandemic and pharmaceutical transport and logistics are challenging.
- As of December 2021, Emirates SkyCargo had <u>transported</u> more than 600 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines to over 80 destinations. At one point in April 2021, one out of every 20 vaccine doses administered around the world had flown on an Emirates aircraft.

Abu Dhabi HOPE Consortium

- The Department of Health Abu Dhabi, Abu Dhabi Ports, Etihad, and other partners formed the HOPE Consortium, a COVID-19 vaccine storage and delivery hub based in Abu Dhabi.
- The HOPE Consortium is partnering with Kenya-based cargo airline Astral Aviation to offer expanded vaccine distribution solutions across the African continent.
- The HOPE Consortium is working with international partners, including US companies UPS and FedEx Express, to expand the distribution range of the vaccine. In its first year of operations, the Consortium <u>delivered</u> more than 210 million vaccine doses to over 60 countries.
