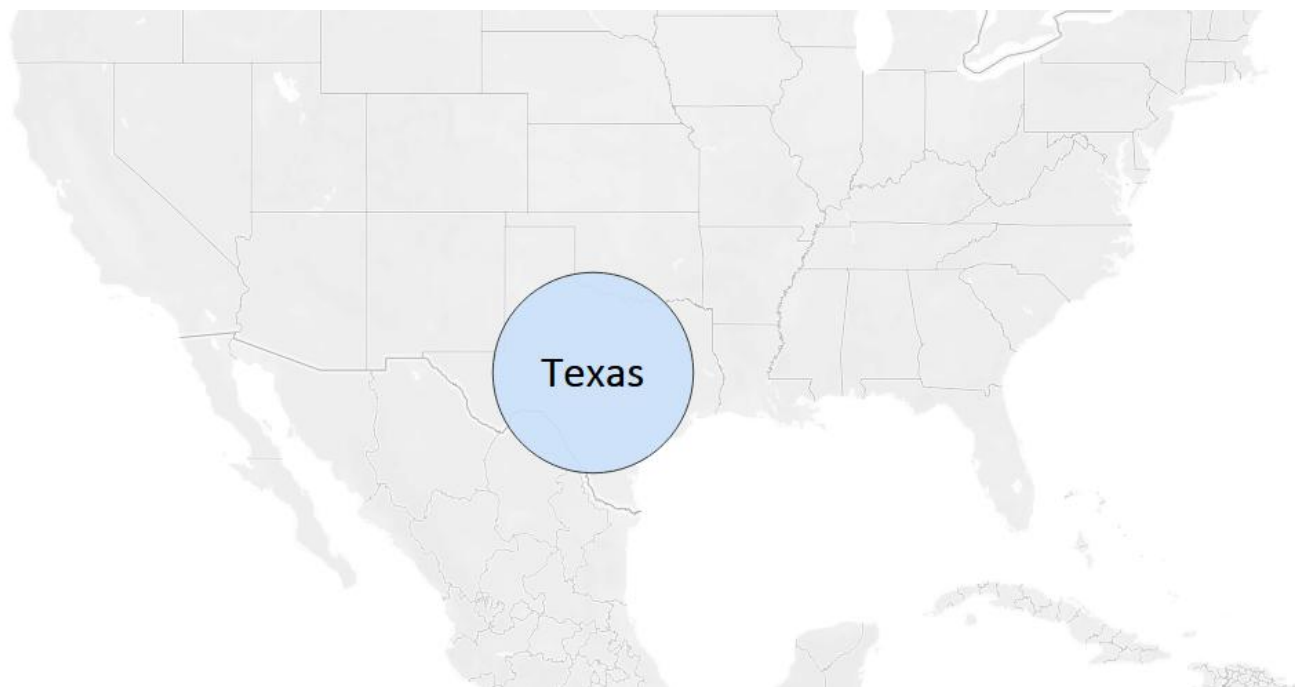

Texas–UAE Trade Report 2024



Report Summary Points

1

Between 2020 and 2024, **Texas** exported goods worth **\$18.2 billion** to the UAE, ranking **1st** among U.S. states. Year-on-year exports declined by **4%**, reaching **\$4.3 billion** in 2024.

2

94% of **Texas's** exports to the UAE, amounting to **\$4.3 billion** in 2024, were driven by its top 10 sectors; the *Computer/Electronics Products* and *Transportation Equipment* sectors were key drivers.

Texas's trade surplus with the UAE reached **\$2.7 billion** in 2024, with year-on-year decline of **16%**.

Texas's port-driven bilateral trade activity with the UAE reached **\$4.8 billion** in 2024, ranking **2nd** among U.S. states and contributing **14%** of the total.

Exhibit 1: Exports to the UAE (\$ billions) | U.S. State Rankings | 2020 - 2024

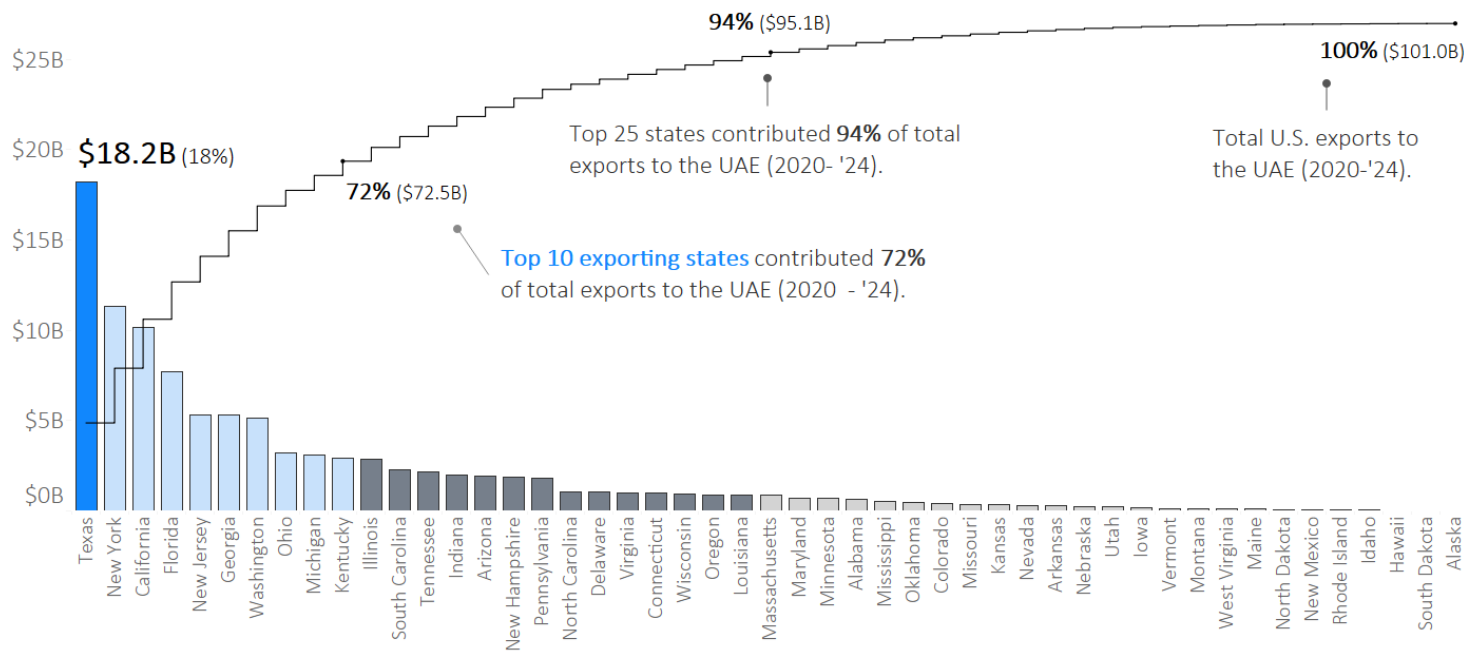
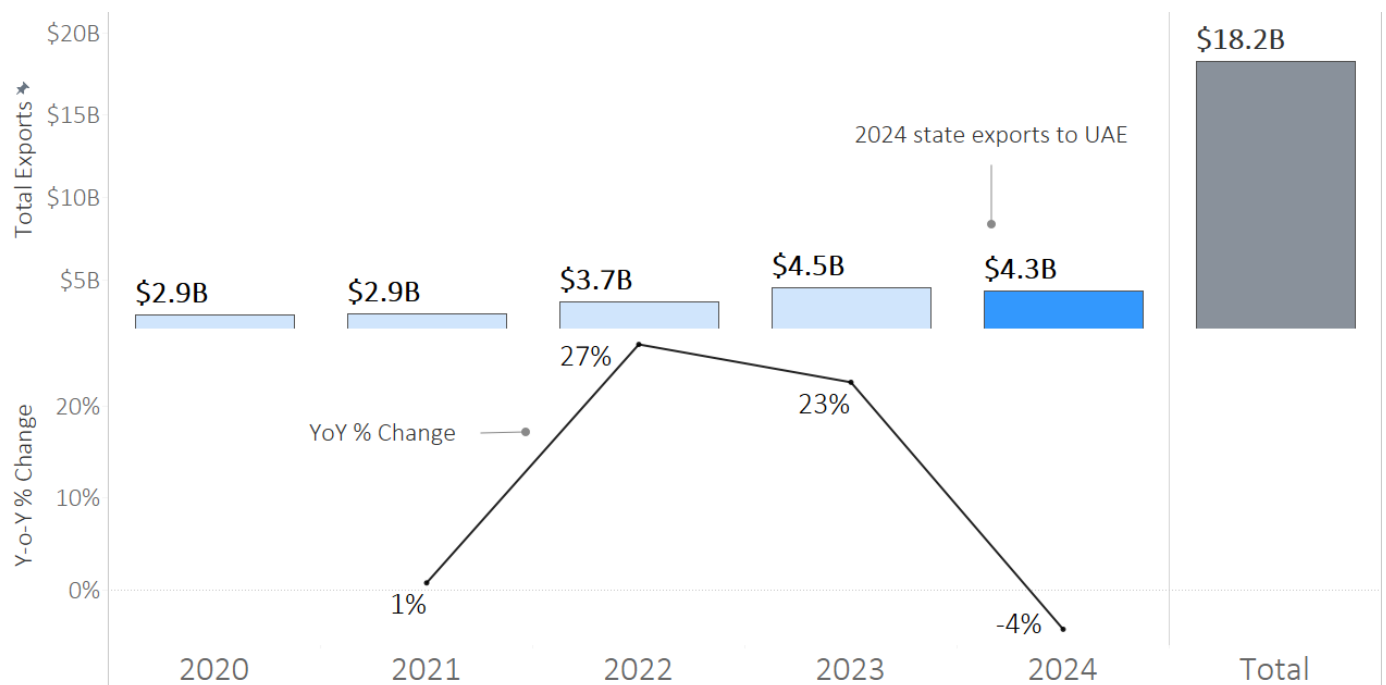


Exhibit 2: Texas Exports to the UAE (\$ billions) | Year-on-Year Percent Change

Exhibit 3: Texas top 10 Exporting Sectors to the UAE | 2023

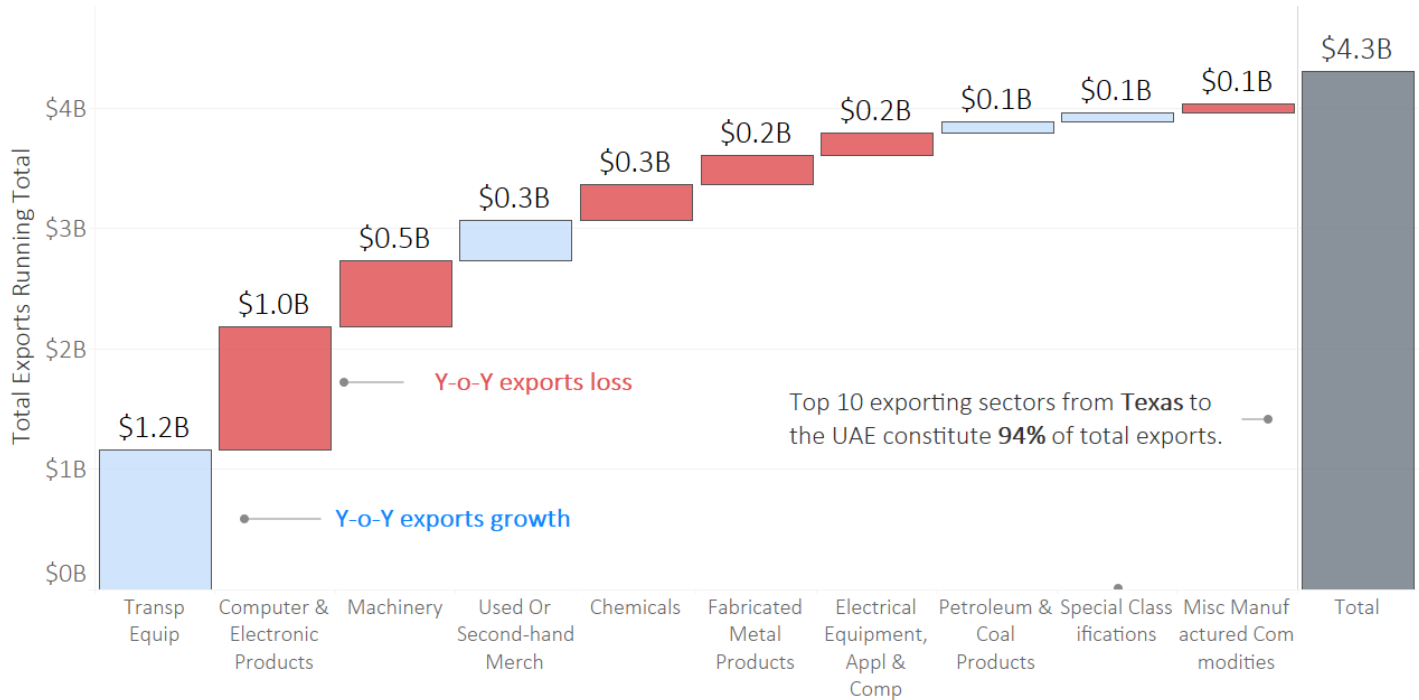

Exhibit 6: U.S.–UAE Trade Surplus | Top 10 States | 2024

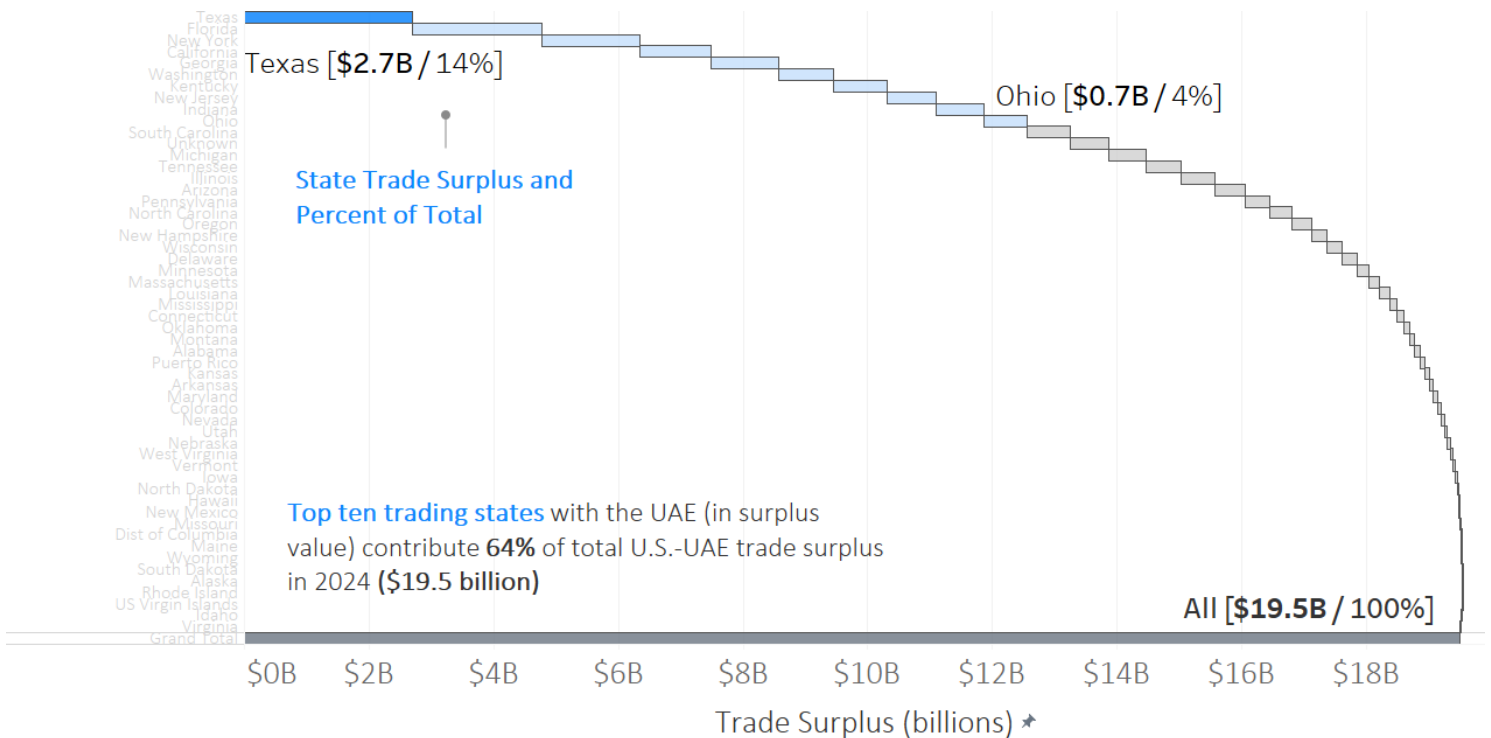
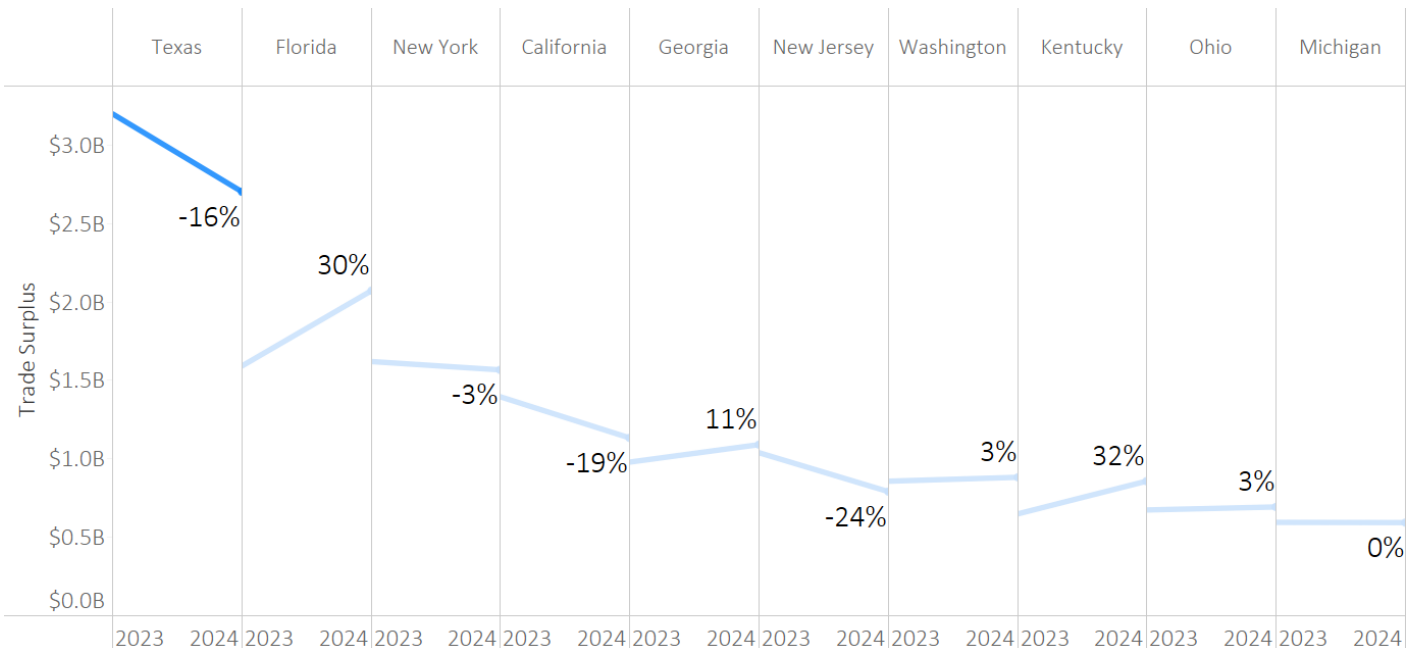


Exhibit 7: U.S.–UAE Trade Surplus | Year-on-Year Percent Change | Top 10 States | 2023 v 2024

Exhibit 8: Port Trade Bilateral Activity | Texas

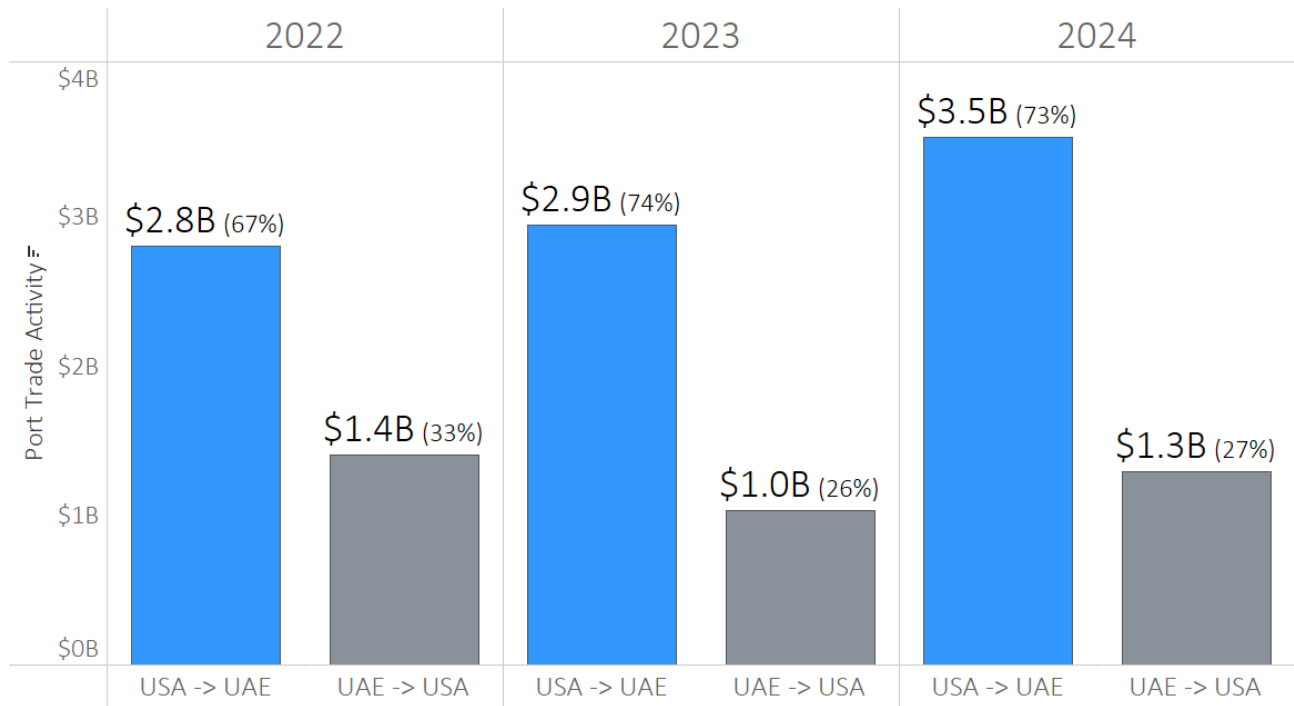
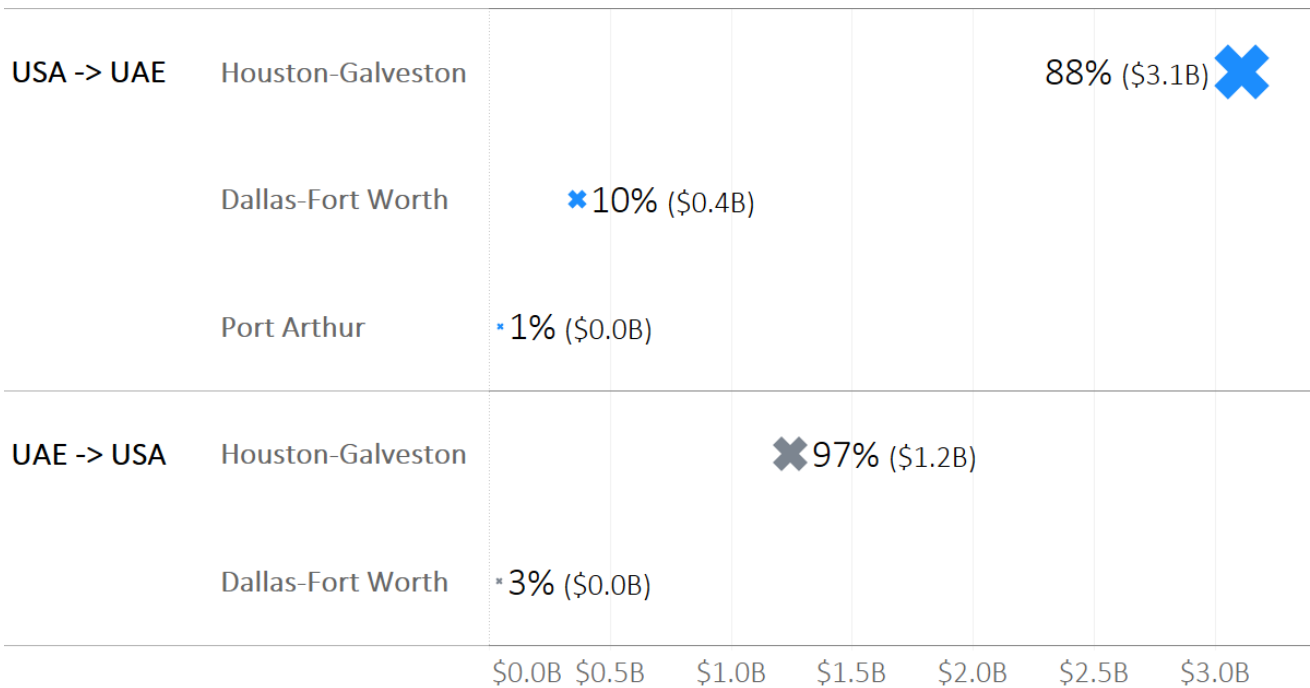


Exhibit 9: Port Activity Distribution | Share of Trade | Texas | 2024

Exhibit 10: Employment Map (Estimated # Jobs Created) | 2024 | *Only depicting states with +4k jobs created

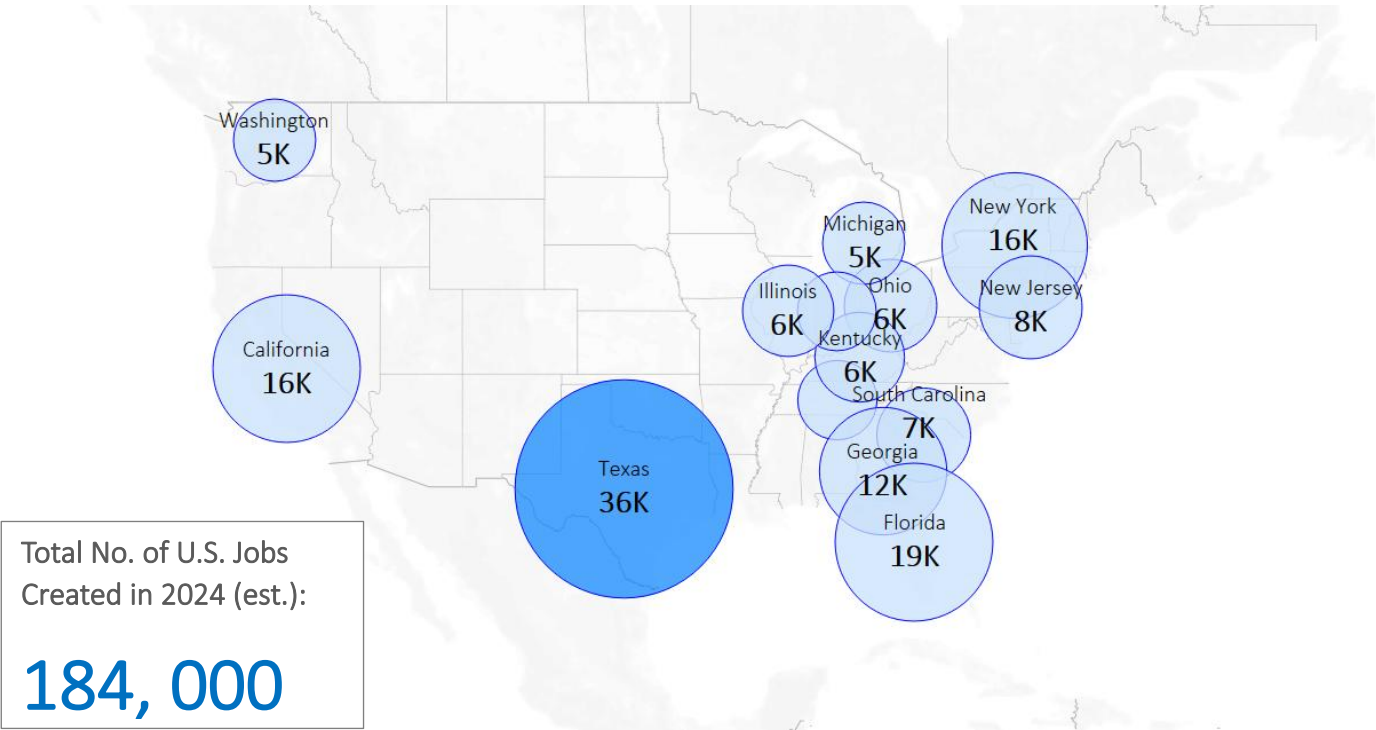

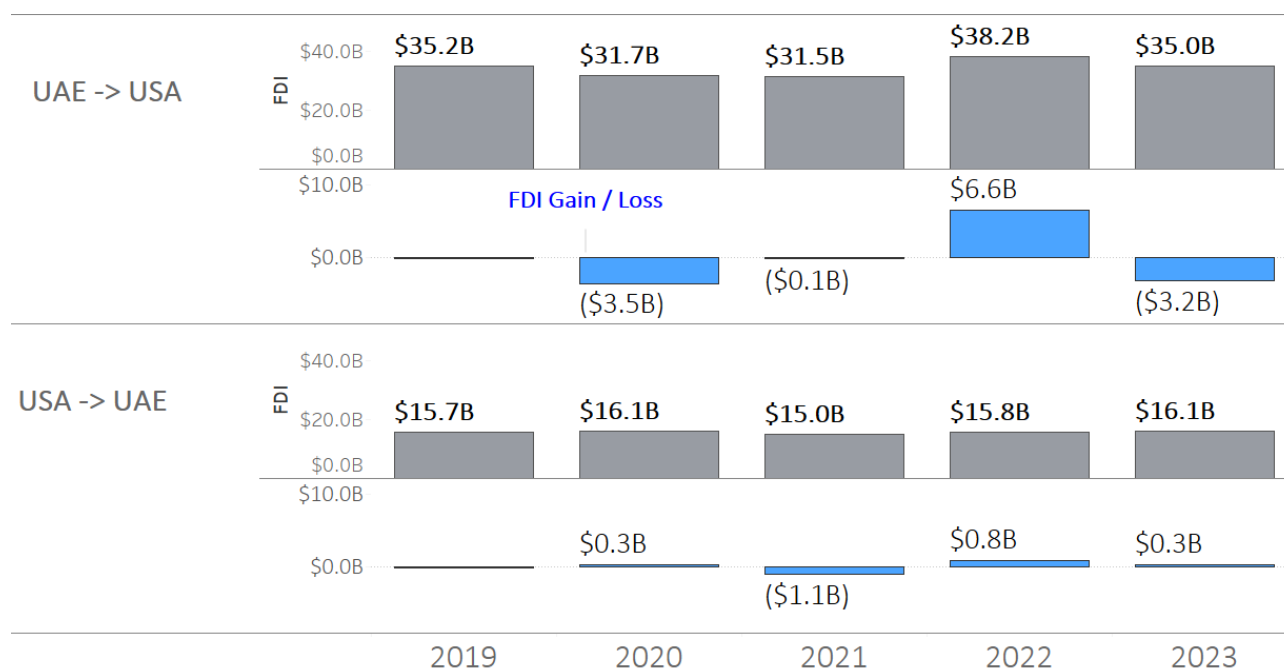
